If we don't know our real identity then there will be an identity crises. We presently are considering our self as a body, mind etc.

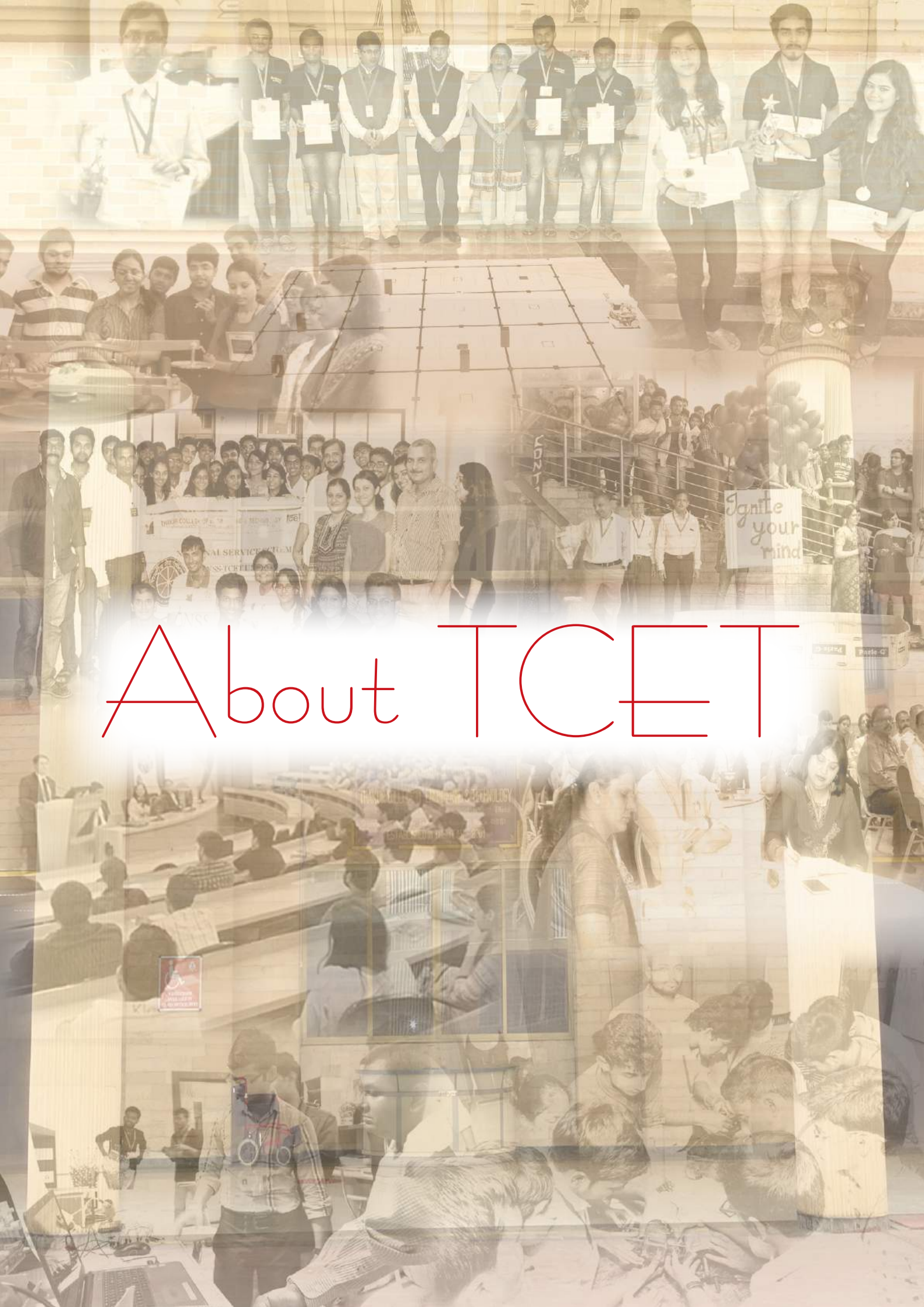

ABOUT THE INSTITUTE



The Thakur College of Engineering & Technology (TCET) was established in academic year 2001-02 with a clear objective of providing quality technical education in tune with international standards and contemporary global requirements. The College is recognized by All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) & Govt. of Maharashtra and is affiliated to the University of Mumbai (UOM). All the courses at the U.G. level, eligible for accreditation in

2011 i.e. Electronics & Telecommunication (EXTC), Information Technology, IT and Computer Engineering (CMPN) were accredited by NBA for three years w.e.f. 16.9.2011. Moreover, these programmes also have been given permanent affiliation w.e.f. A.Y. 2015-16.

The Institute applied for Second time accreditation for its UG Programmes i.e. EXTC, IT and CMPN, and 1st time accreditation of Electronics Engineering (ETRX) as it became eligible after three batches passed out in 2015. All programmes were accredited for 2 years w.e.f. 01-07-2016. Institute will be applying for permanent affiliation of ETRX programme.

TCET is a private self financed linguistic (Hindi speaking) minority institute. It is located in the western suburbs of city at Thakur Village, Kandivali (E), Mumbai and is well connected by western express highway, western railway and the domestic airport.

The management's commitment to excellence and relevance in technical education is reflected in the marvelous infrastructure that is comparable to the finest institution of its type in the country. The imposing five-storied building, housing state-of-the-art computer laboratories, spacious classrooms, well equipped laboratories, workshops, computer centre with server room, a well-stocked library, wide and well lit clean corridors and a large canteen, conference hall, seminar halls has set new standards in providing facilities of international level.

The sprawling campus with lawns, gardens, playgrounds, parking lot and a temple ensures the right academic ambience essential for a centre of higher education.



At TCET, the importance of faculty is well understood and is reflected in qualified, experienced and permanent teaching staff in all departments. A closely monitored quality assurance mechanism ensures proper coverage of syllabus within a right time frame. Additional coaching in comparatively difficult topics in various subjects and group mentoring are some of the healthy practices followed at TCET. Bridge courses and other training programmes prepare the student for professional acceptance in industry with an edge over the others at national and international levels.



Application of modern technology in teaching- learning process and effective day-to-day governance of the college makes TCET unique. 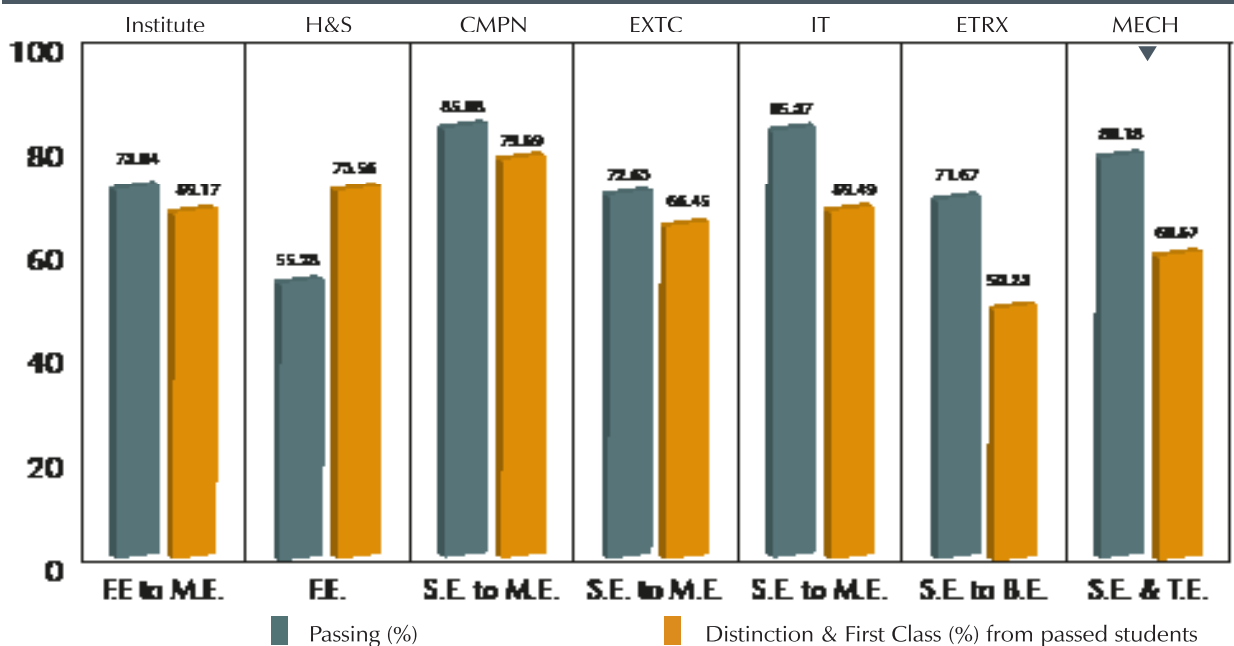

COMPETITIVE EXAMS

- Large no. of students appear for competitive examination viz. GMAT / GRE / TOFEL / GATE / CET (M) for higher studies
- Around 20% qualify in competitive examinations viz. GMAT/ GRE/TOFEL/ GATE/CET CAT
- Students are encouraged for such examination by organizing seminars/ workshops by the professionals from reputed training institutes
- Every academic year such 4-5 programmes are arranged

IMPORTANT TRAINING ACTIVITIES

- **Student Development Programme (SDP)** : It is a one week dedicated programme arranged during the semester break for enhancing students' technical knowledge & soft skills and prepare them for better campus placement. This is followed by regular programmes during semester.
- **Seminar/workshop** : Large number of seminars/workshops are arranged every semester to update students with current needs and challenges in industry.
- **Personality Development Programme** : It prepares students for professional career (at corporate) after successful completion of 4 years B.E.
- **Campus Connect Programme**: To develop students with soft skills and the software engineering knowledge as required for IT industry. This is conducted by Infosys, Accenture Zensar, Persistent, Tata Technologies etc.
- **Industrial Visit** : To familiarise students with industrial environment where they are likely to work as a professional after completing their course successfully.
- **Pre-placement Training Program** : This is conducted for all third year students to make them employable and face various challenges during campus placement & higher studies process by providing aptitude, technical and soft-skill training.

PLACEMENT

TCET has an enviable record in placement of students. The institute has been accredited by major companies like Infosys, Tata Consultancy Services, Accenture, IGATE and Tech-Mahindra etc.

At present more than 70 companies are visiting for campus recruitment every year and almost all eligible students are placed through campus. Special efforts are also taken to place the non-eligible students.

LEARNING RESOURCE CENTRE (LRC) CENTRAL LIBRARY

Learning Resource Centre (Central library) is located on 4th floor of the College building with 840 Sq. m. built area. LRC is highly modular. Mr. Devidas Kalwale is the Librarian and looks after the development of the library. Library is running for 12 hrs (8:00 am to 8:00 pm) on office working days (Mon-Fri). Additional seating arrangement is also done on demand during term-test, semester end examination.

This was only possible because of the combined effort and knowledge of the teachers whose supreme art is to awaken joy in creative expression and knowledge within the students.

While having accomplished milestones and substantial goals in this academic year, our principle of continual progress and putting in unparalleled effort for this progress would continue- without any complacency.

TCET is one of the most popular institutes for overall development of students which results in high performance and stakeholders’ satisfaction. The institute not only takes care of students’ development but employees too. Their professional enhancement is also done through: annual international conference, STTPs, seminars, workshops, technical paper presentations, etc. Such rigorous activities have resulted in some of centers of excellence to TCET like: TCET- TEXAS Instruments (EXTC/ETRX), TATA Technologies (MECH), TCET-Accenture Innovation Center (CMPN/IT), ARM Processors (ETRX), IBM Technologies, R & D cell & incubation centre, Thakur Center of Excellence and Robotics centre in collaboration with IIT-B.

To carry out its research activities, TCET has dedicated R & D Cell and incubation center. Looking at its research oriented culture, TCET received grants from various funding agencies like AICTE-MODROB, IIT Bombay, UoM and DST.

Other than regular curricula, TCET conducts various co-curricular activities for overall development of students like: Student Development Programme, Industrial Visit & Internship, Mini-project competition, Pre-placement Training, Zephyr (Tech Fest), Bridge Courses, BE Projects Competition, General English Proficiency Test, Various Technical Competitions, Spoken Tutorials, Campus Connect, etc. and Extra-Curricular Activities like Blood Donation Camp, TCET-MUN, NSS Camp and other social activities, T-Spark, Enertia, Sojourn, E-week, etc.

STUDENT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (SDP)

The academic year 2015-16 began on July 6, 2015 with Student Development Programme. The odd semester commenced with the intake of new students. The academic calendar was launched, followed by a Student Development Program (SDP), organized during 6 to 11 July 2015. The second and third year students of the college were provided with extra training on topics that are recent, and not covered entirely by the curriculum. This programme introduced the needs of the students of their respective industries, and corporate world. Various activities such as seminars, workshops, group assignments, mock aptitude and technical tests, feedback sessions were organized and went as planned. SEMESTER ORIENTATION PROGRAMME (SOP)

Semester Orientation Programme (SOP) was conducted for all the students during 13 to 17 July, 2015 for odd semester and January 18 to 22, 2016 for even semester. It was a department level programme, which aimed at creating an overall understanding of the semester. The orientation sessions of even semester were designed throughout the semester for an overall view about the orientation. These informative sessions were oriented about:

3. R&D Initiatives and Activities
4. Examination and Evaluation
5. Students Council Activities
6. Training and Placement Activities
7. Higher Education and Online Certification Cell

The orientation also focuses on other important information regarding subject foundation and some prerequisites. Students were informed about the credits, introduced to each subject, and given motivation and guidance for academics. It was conducted by the faculty members of the respective departments. These sessions prepared the students for the upcoming semester, and helped them to be mentally prepared for the term expectations, and the goals to be achieved. After orientation, the students got a real taste of their rigorous academic activity.

TCET: AN ALL-ROUNDER TECHNICAL INSTITUTE

Providing the right ambience for developing professional skills as well as an environment for growth of leadership and managerial skills to student, TCET has been an all-rounder technical institute. The Students' Council and the Student chapters of different committees were formed during the month of August.

Selection of council members is done based on interviews and analysis by following the guidelines of respective professional bodies. The core council was formed by election amongst the council members.

CO- & EXTRA- CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Various student activities were organized under different student forums by the respective core committee members under the guidance of faculty in-charge and heads of departments. More details about the activities can be seen in the report of various councils. These activities are conducted on yearly basis and help in personality development, leadership and various other skills. Faculty in-charges and their team members have taken leadership in conducting the programmes.

The annual technical symposium, Zephyr- 2015 was held in September. Being a technical institute, this technical festival saw a lot of innovative ideas implemented by truly passionate students of the institute. The annual inter- college sports meet (ENERTIA 2016) and the cultural festivals (Sojourn 2016) were organized to provide a platform for the students' skills and talents.

The fifth TCET Alumni meet was held on Saturday, December 19, 2015. The objective was to

assemble former students under one roof and to form Alumni Association of TCET with the keen vision that further it would help in the augmentation of name, fame and growth of the institute, moreover, to create the platform for lifelong learning. Registered alumni present were 279, number of faculty and staff members was 110 and student council and participating students were 60. Total count was 460. Alumni interaction and stage sharing was done by Alumni about experience in TCET and outside world.

This year also a Degree Certificate Distribution Ceremony was held in TCET on January 29, 2016. The convocation ceremony was held to felicitate all the students who have passed out in A.Y. 2014-15.

Multicon-W 2016, an international conference and workshops hosted by TCET in the month of February, saw a huge number of participants from and outside the college. About 400+ students participated in the event. Along with the international conference, workshops and national conference were also conducted. Department of Humanities and Sciences has successfully conducted the first ever national conference.

TCET witnessed the celebration of Marathi Bhasha Divas on 27 February 2016 along with MULTICON W 2016. An encouraging number of participants came together to celebrate the language of Marathi. Winners in all categories were felicitated.

Swach Bharat Abhiyaan was scheduled on 2nd October for creating awareness about cleanliness in the Campus. All the students and teachers were invited to be part of this cleanliness drive. The cleanliness drive was conducted to clean the area in and around the campus. Many NSS students and staff participated in the cleanliness drive. To motivate the students and set example the Principal participated in this drive enthusiastically. All the students appreciated the thought and agreed to contribute to cleanliness drive to make INDIA Clean.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

TCET keeping up with its honourable reputation of having a great performance at all the university exams, once again out-performed its results from last year, with its results in May 2016 and December 2015 examinations of first year. TRAINING & PLACEMENT (T&P)

The Training and Placement Cell organized pre-placement training in the month of December 2015 as well as June 2016. The cell also organized the Infosys Campus Connect Programme in collaboration with the Infosys software company. TRAINING & PLACEMENT CELL

Training

In the era of ICT, institute realizes the radical changes in the employment pattern of fresh graduates. This is chiefly because of the following reasons:

- ▣▣▣▣ Industries desire fresh graduates to be productive from the very first day
- ▣▣▣▣ Student looks for campus placement in blue chip companies particularly in the area of ICT/ITES

This needs:

- ▣▣▣▣ Sound communication skills
- ▣▣▣▣ Strong domain knowledge
- ▣▣▣▣ Awareness of corporate work etiquette
- ▣▣▣▣ Familiarity with recent trends and challenges

Therefore, at TCET importance is given to training programmes.

Training at institute level is taken care by T&P Cell. It provides assistance to the students in counseling and guiding for their successful career which is a crucial interface between the stages of completion of academic programme of the students and their entry into the professional career.

Placement

TCET has an enviable record in placement of students. The institute has been accredited by major companies like Infosys, Tata Consultancy Services, Accenture, iGate, Tech-Mahindra, etc.

At present more than 45 companies are visiting for campus recruitment every year and almost all eligible students are placed through campus. Special efforts are also taken to place the non-eligible students.

Important Training Activities

- ▣▣▣▣ **Student Development Programme (SDP)** : It is a one week dedicated programme arranged during the semester break for enhancing students' technical knowledge & soft skills and prepare them for better campus placement. This is followed by regular programmes during semester.
- ▣▣▣▣ **Seminar/ workshop**: Large number of seminars/ workshops are arranged every semester to update students with current needs and challenges in industry.

- **Personality Development Programme:** It prepares students for professional career (at corporate) after successful completion of 4 years of Engineering.
- **Infosys Campus Connect Programme:** It is three weeks dedicated programme which facilitates students with soft skills and the software engineering knowledge as required for IT industry.
- **Industrial Visit:** Industrial Visits are organized to familiarize students with industrial environment and understand real life practices, concepts and processes as they are likely to work as a professional after completing their course successfully.
- **Pre-placement Training Programme:** It is 2 weeks programme conducted for all third year students to make them employable and face various challenges during campus placement & higher studies process by providing them training in aptitude, technical and soft-skills.
- **Internship:** Internship is helpful for suitable industry oriented skill based training for students' professional careers which are similar in some ways to apprenticeships for trade and vocational jobs. This would help students to understand the working environment of the organization.
- **Outhouse Project:** It provides an industrial exposure to final year students for their project works as well as to develop their career in high tech industrial requirements. Companies give students the opportunity to emerge out with their interest in various streams and enhance implementation of basic concepts in their domains
- **ZenSar Employability Skills Development Programme:** It is 6 weeks programme which provides Green Channel Placement at no cost for pre-final & final year students towards better readiness for the IT industry. The programme focuses on technical and soft skills.

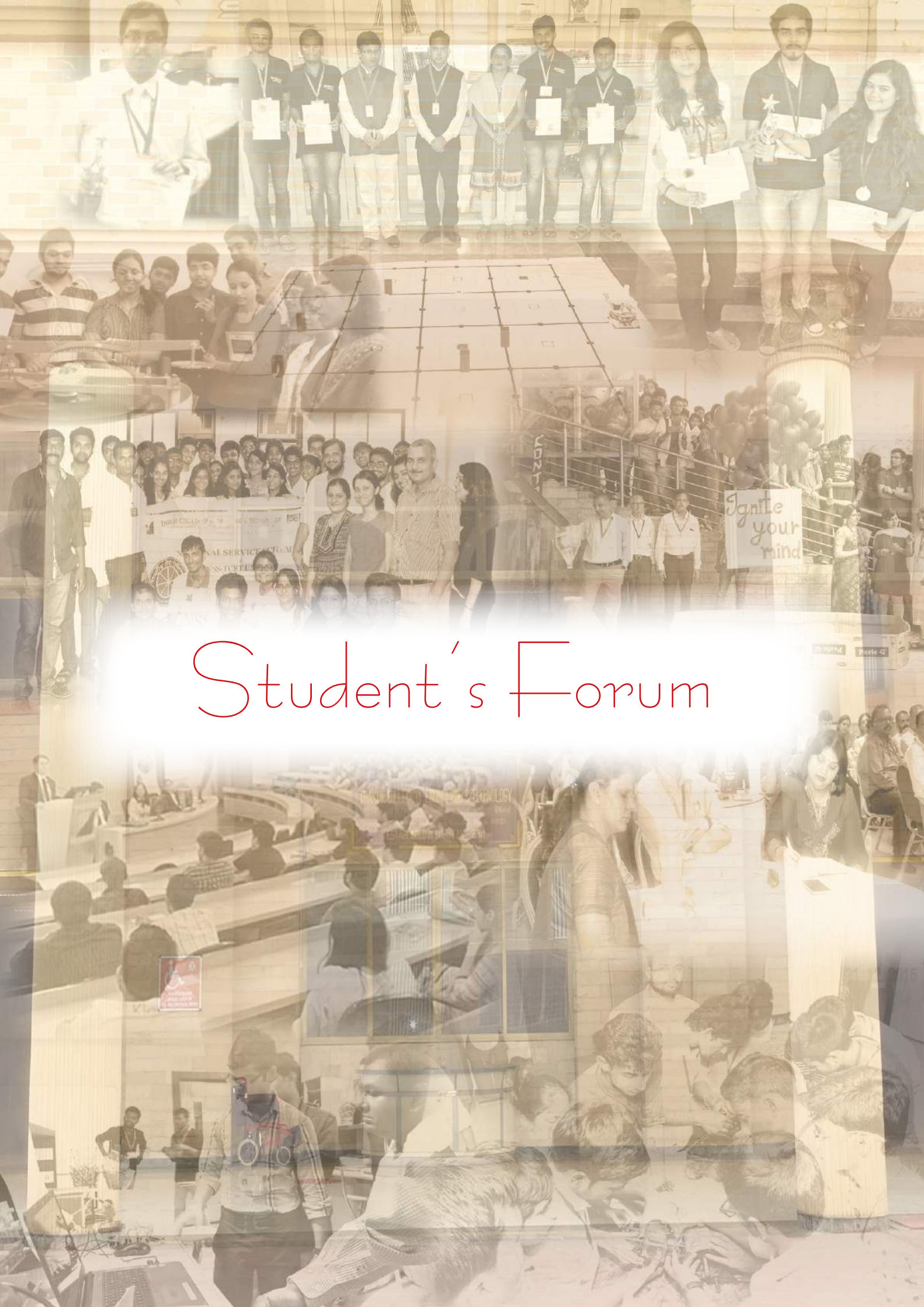

In the previous edition, TCET-MUN had 180 participants, out of which 64 were TCET students. The committees formed under TCET- MUN were UNHRC (United Nations Human Rights Council), DISEC (Disarmament and International Security Committee), HUNSC (Historic United Nations Security Council), UNODC (United Nations Office of Drugs and Crime), SOCHUM (Social, Humanitarian and Cultural) and UEFA (Union of European Football Associations Congress).

Their agenda and a brief summary of their discussions is given below.

The agendas of UNHRC were 'Implementing freedom of expression and media freedom within religious and cultural considerations' and 'Human right violations caused by the insurgent activities of Al-Shabab'. The committee began to discuss agenda I which passed through voting. The committee had a lot of mutual co-operation and confidence. The committee had two working papers which were discussed. The committee successfully passed a draft resolution.

In DISEC, the debate started with unanimous voting on the agenda 'Curbing the rise of ISIS'. The committee started with the basics and introduction and led to some very radical measures to combat the insurgency group. The committee introduced three working papers and passed a draft resolution that was able to curb the rise of ISIS with the right balance of diplomacy and use of force.

In HUNSC, the debate focused on the 1990 Gulf War. The discussion had a some ups and downs, allies broken and formed and despite all, came together for greater good of humanity and unanimously passed a resolution that was good enough and stated proper solutions.

In UNODC, the agenda discussed was 'Methods to combat illicit trafficking of counterfeit goods and transnational organised crime'. The committee came up with every aspect of trafficking of goods and discussed all sections. The discussion was remarkable and went on improving with time. The committee successfully passed a draft resolution by consensus.

In SOCHUM, the agenda discussed was 'Elimination of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and other related intolerance'. The delegates since day 1 seemed very well prepared. This committee very well discussed issues, causes, facts and very well moved to solutions. The young delegates also faced the crisis that was introduced on day two very confidently. This committee had 3 working papers and was the first committee in TCET-MUN 2015 to pass a resolution.

In UEFA, the discussion began with 'Discussion on the retention of 2022 world cup at Qatar'. The delegates of the committee were quick learners and the committee had great points. The discussion was as accurate as any conventional committee. There was decorum and procedures were followed. On day two, crisis was introduced in the committee. The last session of the committee was very enthusiastic, good working papers and resolutions came up.

The International Press held a press conference during TCET-MUN in HUNSC and the DISEC. It was the first time since the beginning of TCET-MUN that live The discussion was as formal and accurate as any conventional committee. There was decorum and procedures were followed were held in the committee sessions, where countries were stating their stance and discussions were heating up and reaching high quality.

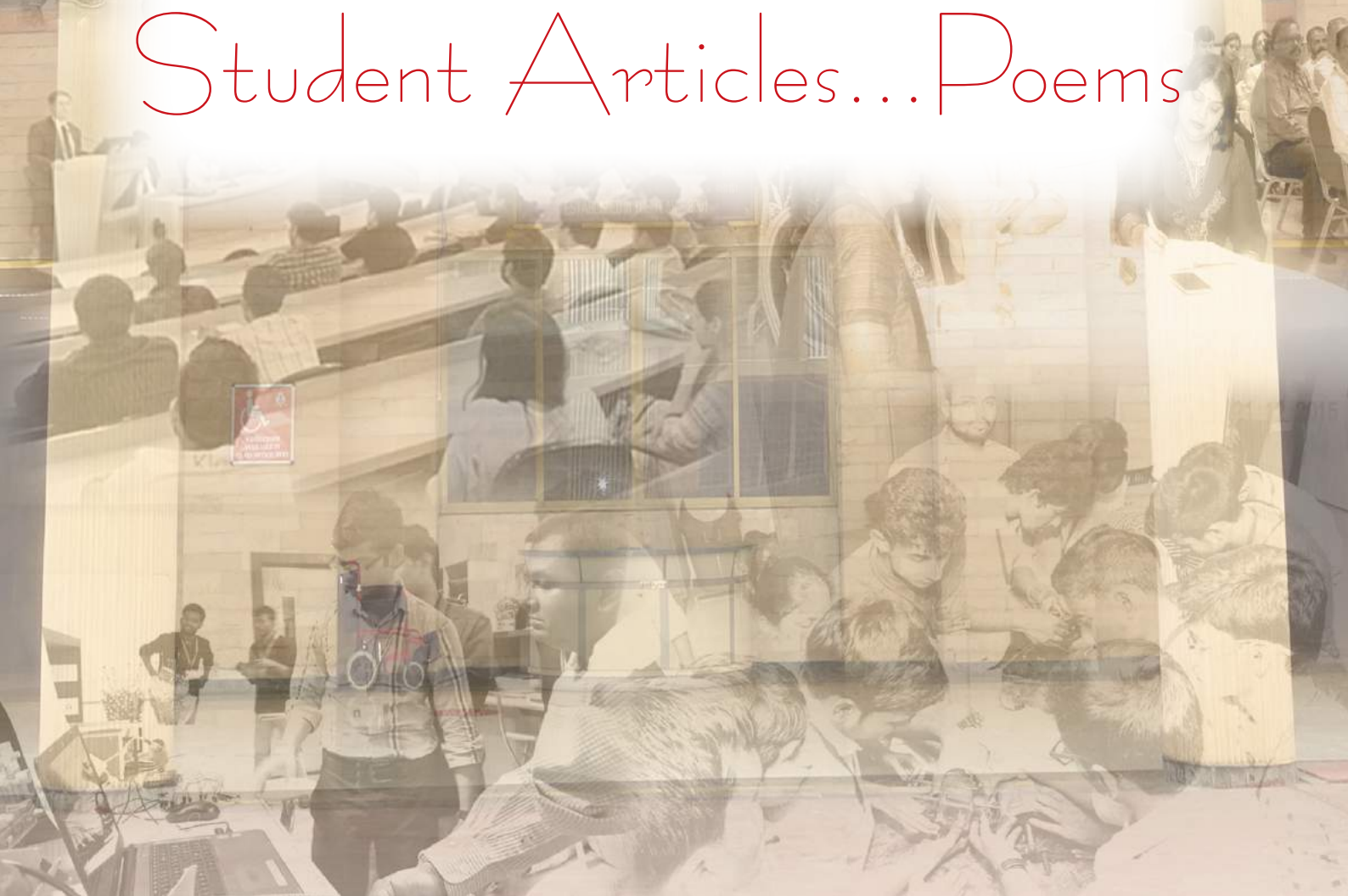

Education is the anchor that holds life together through choppy waters. Even a hardworking illiterate person at some point feels that the tool of education would have definitely helped him increase his output and earn more. It is rightly stated by Victor Hugo that “He who opens a school door, closes a prison”.

In today’s fast-paced advancing world where there is cut-throat competition, the importance of education is increasing day by day. Be it a cart-puller or a successful entrepreneur, all want their kids to have the best of the degrees for which they are ready to work for more hours and meet the financial needs for attaining education.

In the 90’s where education was not given that importance by parents, their kid studying in a vernacular medium would be enough. Then slowly English medium schools were given more preference. There was a serious decision needed to be taken by parents whether vernacular medium should be preferred or a bit better English medium which would gain importance in the coming years.

Today in the 21st century not only vernacular medium schools have gone out of fashion but now there is a serious thinking on the issue – “Which board of English medium school should be preferred?! SSC? ICSE? CBSE? IB? IGCSE? The dilemma of choosing the board of education becomes a prime concern for parents. The choice of board makes a significant difference in the early development of the child and his/her exposure to the kind of education system that we have.

In India, if we measure on a scale of 100, 80% youngsters are STATE BOARD pass outs and remaining 20% from ICSE, CBSE or other international boards. Majority fall under STATE BOARD pass outs because in the 90's majority of the parents were themselves STATE BOARD pass outs from vernacular medium. Slowly they became aware of the importance of English medium schools in the coming years but were unaware of the importance and differences of different boards. Be it CBSE, ICSE or other international boards; all have started gaining attention now but in the past it was either preferred by higher upper class families due to their high fee structure or by highly educated parents who knew the benefits their kids would obtain in the future by following the curriculum of these boards.

But in the current scenario, 80% youngsters who are STATE BOARD pass outs and obtaining for fields in Science stream are facing very serious problems. As the level of STATE BOARD syllabus is very low compared to the syllabus of other boards, though State Board students pass out their schools with high percentile above 90, but fall short to grasp the syllabus of higher education as level increases drastically specially in subjects like Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics. They also lack the abilities to face competitive examinations as STATE BOARD emphasizes more on rote learning and syllabus is not modified according to the changing times and standard textbooks need to be followed.

CBSE and ICSE syllabus is modified at regular intervals and most importantly, it is designed in a scientific manner. Syllabus are prepared by following the concept of 'Front Line Curriculum' which is more compatible with global educational standard. Whereas if international boards like IB is concerned there are no prescribed textbooks and a lot of freedom in learning is given. Focus of curriculum is more on applied knowledge which helps in the long run. IGCSE curriculum is also application oriented. But the fee structures of this boards is not affordable to all.

So the STATE BOARD pass out students who form a majority in the current scenario not only face the grasping issue but also have to compete directly with other board pass out students who find it easy to grasp the study level as they have already done the basics of it in their latter school years. In the 80% state board pass out, 5% who can manage with the drastic increase in level may go smoothly but the remaining 75% stand helplessly in the cut throat competition which directly affect their confidence and self-esteem. One can imagine a condition of a youngster who scored 96% in STATE BOARD exam directly fall to 60% while pursuing his higher studies.

The youngster at the start of his true career only starts doubting on his abilities as percentile and marks are given too much importance in our system. The students who find difficult to take all this go in depression at such young age. Not only they have to struggle to make a mark in the cut throat competition but also face their parents and teachers who sometimes fail to understand

them. How can you expect a tree to stand strong in extreme conditions if its roots are only weak?! Why this difference?! Why is the strength and future of nation being experimented so much?!

Late Mr. APJ Abdul Kalam dreamt that by 2020 India will superpower in the field of Science & Technology. Is this scenario going to achieve the aim, where excelling is seen nowhere, instead majority of students are facing stress and depression issues and doubting their career paths which leads to younger generation facing towards suicide!!

At present in the field of education, educationist are trying their level best to levelize the differences between the boards and carry out a single board pattern. The questions and solutions to it are on the papers dealing to the different boards. If we look very closely every board has its equal pros and cons but we can also see some students facing too much problem and some finding it okay. Why such a difference? It definitely means that some board is lacking too much than the other. Though there will be differences between boards but ultimately the take-off level of a student passing out from any board should be levelized to some extent.

Brain mapping of the students should be done right from school level as done in foreign countries because whichever board, ultimately in the end everything depends on the individual provided proper guidance is given. It's truly stated by Norton Juster that "... It's not just learning that's important. It's learning what to do with what you learn and learning why you learn things that matters".

So levelizing of the boards both curriculum wise and financially to some extent is definitely going to make a huge difference for the students and our education system as changes at the primary level will help build strong foundation for students. It will help them write any exam or face any competition in the future and put a step forward more confidently in this fast advancing world.
