





INTRODUCTION TO NCC

What is National Cadet Corps ?



The National Cadet Corps (NCC) is a vouth development movement. It has potential for nation building. The NCC provides opportunities to the youth of the country for their all-round development with a sense of Duty, Commitment, Dedication, Discipline and Moral Values so that they become able leaders and useful citizens. The NCC provides exposure to the cadets in a wide range of activities., with a distinct emphasis on Social Services, Discipline and Adventure Training. The NCC is open to all regular students of schools and colleges on a voluntary basis. The students have no liability for active military service.

The National Cadet Corps has established a university unit established under the defence Act, 1917 with the aim of addressing the shortage of ARMY.





GENESIS

The Kashmir War of 1948 taught a very important lesson to India, that freedom needs to be protected by strong Armed Forces. Its immediate manifestation was that the recommendations of Kunzuru committee were placed before the Constituent Assembly (Legislature) on 13 Mar 1948. A draft Bill was sent to the Constituent Assembly (Legislative) on 19 Mar 1948, which evoked great interest and enthusiasm amongst all members. After due deliberations and amendments, the Bill was passed by the Assembly on 08 Apr 1948.

The Bill received the assent of the Governor General on 16 Apr 1948, and

the National Cadet Corps came into being by an Act of the Parliament Act No. XXXI of 1948 designated 'The National Cadet Corps Act 1948'. This Act with 13 clauses, prescribed the formation of the National Cadet Corps in India.

The first step in the process of raising of the NCC was setting up of the

NCC Secretariat now called Headquarters Directorate General NCC

The Central Govt accepted the opinion of the Provincial Govts and the Standing Committee's recommendations for the formation of a Cadet Corps which was to be named as "National Cadet Corps", as recommended by the Kunzuru Committee. The Bill received the assent of the Governor General on 16 Apr 1948, and the National Cadet Corps came into being by an Act of the Parliament Act No. XXXI of 1948 designated 'The National Cadet Corps Act 1948'. This Act with 13 clauses, prescribed the formation of the National Cadet Corps in India. The first step in the process of raising of the

In fact, even before the NCC Bill was passed by the Constituent Assembly (Legislative), the Ministry of Defence had set up the nucleus of the NCC Secretariat, with Col (later retired as Chief of Army Staff) Gopal Gurunath Bewoor as the first Director of the NCC. He took over as the Director of NCC on 31 Mar 1948. The schools and colleges opened after summer vacation and the NCC of

Independent India was inaugurated on 15 Jul 1948. The journey of this Indian youth organisation, which has now become the largest uniformed youth organisation in the world had begun.



NCC ORGANISATION



The National Cadet Corps is headed by Director General, An Army officer rank of Lieutanant General, who is responsible for the functioning of NCC in the country through the National Cadet Corps headquarters situated in Delhi. At the State level, the country has been divided into 17 Directorates covering all states and union territories. Each of the state NCC Directorates headquarters controls two to fourteen group headquarters. While directorates are command by Brigadiers of their equivalents, the groups are command by Colonels or equivalents from the Air Force and Navy, NCC Units are command by Major/Lieutanant Colonel or their equivalent.

Certificate type NCC unit:

- Certificate 'A': Junior Division/Wing NCC.
- Certificate 'B': Senior Division/Wing NCC.

ELIGIBILITIES FOR CERTIFICATE EXAMINATION

FOR "A" CERTIFICATE EXAMINATION (JUNIOR DIVISION)

- 1. Must be in Second year of NCC.
- 2.You should be attending the Annual Training Camp.
- 3.The candidate must have atleast 75% of total training time available.





ELIGIBILITIES FOR CERTIFICATE EXAMINATION

FOR "B" CERTIFICATE EXAMINATION (SENIOR DIVISION)

- 1. Cadet should be in the second year of SD / SW NCC training.
- 2. You must have attended one annual training course for the training camp / NIC / Attachment and Army, Navy, Air Force
- Attachment and Army, Navy, Air Force
 Units.
- 3.The cadet must have at least 75% of the total training time.

FOR "C" CERTIFICATE EXAMINATION (SENIOR DIVISION)

- 1. Cadet must have passed 'B' certificate.
- Cadet should be in second/third year of SD/SW NCC Training.
- 3.The Cadet must have attendance a minimum of 75% of the periods of 3rd year.
- 4. You should have attended two camps

<u>HOW TO GET INTO INDIAN</u> <u>ARMS FORCES THROUGH NCC.</u>

The National Cadet Corps is one of the largest academy reserve forces of India. NCC is open to all academic institution going pupils to be enrolled in any of the nearest NCC unit. The NCC gives a vast array of openings to pupils which would either be unattainable to get outside or will fetch you a huge fortune. In addition to this, NCC 'C' certificate holder can directly go to the SSB interview, skipping the Common Entrance Exam (CEE).

Then how you can join the Armed Forces using NCC 'C' certificate:

All the three services of the military have some voids reserved for the NCC fancy men/women,

- Indian Military Academy, Dehradun 64
- Officers Training Academy, Chennai –
 100

Indian Navy and Indian Naval Academy – 6 per course





<u>HOW TO GET INTO INDIAN</u> <u>ARMS FORCES THROUGH NCC.</u>

- Indian Navy and Indian Naval Academy 6 per course
- Indian Air Force in Air Force Academy 10 in all courses, including flying training courses
- You need to have a minimal 3 times of service in any of the three sets of NCC to be eligible to write 'C' instrument quiz.
- In your 'C' certificate quiz, get a 'B' grade (though 'B' and 'C' grade don't have any value, so try to get 'A' grade).
- To join the army, apply for NCC Special Entry Scheme through your directorate ask your unit CO to foster your operation to the directorate which will also further it to the recruiting directorate. However, follow the procedure of SSB interview, If you get shortlisted. All the vacuities through this are to be filled by NCC cadets.
- To join the Navy and Air Force, there isn't any special entry but the entries which are published from time to time have some voids reserved for NCC'C' certification holders. You just need to mention in your exercise that you have an NCC'C' certificat





HOW TO GET INTO INDIAN ARMS FORCES THROUGH NCC.

- Although the fancy men of Air Wing and Naval Wing have some vacuities in Air Force and Navy independently, they can apply for NCC Special Entry Scheme to join the army.
- But the fancy men who are from Army Wing aren't eligible for the voids in the Air Force or the Navy.
- Naval Wing over Army Wing depending on your first preference. In my case, I wish to join the Air Force, so I've decided for Air Wing over Naval and Army. Though Naval Wing's NCC blanks are out of bound for me, I'm still eligible to join the Army through Special Entry Scheme.
- Although for Air Force, you need to apply within 12 months of leaving NCC (along with AFCAT or CDSE), you can apply for others as long as you have the age limit.





HOW TO GET INTO INDIAN ARMS FORCES THROUGH NCC.

You'll be awarded superfluous marks in your SSB as follows:

Certificate Army, Navy, Air Force

- 'A' 5 add marks on overall marks scored in SSB 22 marks in SSB 3 marks in SSB
- 'B' 8 Same as below 44 marks in SSB 4 marks in SSB
- 'C' 10 same no written quiz 66 marks in SSB 5 marks in SSB
- At least 50-60 marks in scale bore for C certificate to be applicable. NCC certificate alone would not have any value.
- Age limits would be as per the announcement and date of inception of the training for a particular course.





CONGRATULATIONS GIVEN TO CARDS DURING THE STRUCTURE OF OTHER ORGANIZATIONS.

- For OR/Sailors/Airmen Bonus marks/weightage/preference given in the recruitment.
- Para-Military Forces: BSF/CISF/ITBP/Coastal Guard - Bonus marks/weightage/ preference given in the recruitment.
- CRPF NCC 'B'/'C' Certificate holders are considered eligible for recruitment to gazetted posts.

State Governments -Preference given to the NCC Cadets in State Government Services involving the police.





BENEFITS OF NCC IN DEGREE COLLEGE

There are many benefits in degree colleges if you are a NCC cadet. They are as follows:

1.Reservation education

 In many competitive exams there are reservation for NCC cadets who have C certificate.

2. Defence benefits

The candidates who wants to join defence forces then NCC
 'C' certificate is very useful for them to go in SSB directly.

A)Special entry for men and women

- In OTA ,Chennai , 50 vacancies for 'C' certificate holders for NCC special entry.
 - In AFC, Hyderabad there are 10% vacancies reserved for c certificate holders.

B)Recruitment as Jawan

Brigadier Mohammad Usman

Born in Bibipur, Uttar Pradesh, this man of steel joined the Indian army in 1934. During the Indo-Pakistan war of 1947/48, Brigadier Usman repulsed a fierce attack on Naushera and Jhangar, two highly strategic locations in Jammu and Kashmir, and was named by his fellow soldiers 'The Lion of Naushera.'

At the time of the Partition, he was made the offer of becoming the Chief of the Pakistani Army but he chose to stay in India. He left the Baloch regiment of Pakistan and was inducted into the Dogra regiment in India. After the Battle of Naushera, where the Pakistanis suffered heavy casualties at his hands, the same country that had courted him to become the chief of the army, now went ahead and placed prize money of Rs. 50,000 on his head.

Brigadier Usman was not just a fierce soldier but also a compassionate man. He never got married and used to donate a large part of his salary to support poor children and pay for their education. This inspiring and exemplary officer of the Indian Army died on July 3, 1948, defending Jhangar. His last words were, "I am dying but let not the territory we were fighting for fall to the enemy."

He was awarded the Maha Vir Chakra posthumously for his great courage and leadership.

"I am not that irresponsible that I will die without fulfilling my duties for the country."

Did he die fighting?

It was 9.30 in the morning when the phone rang. It was from the brigade headquarters of Capt.Anuj Nayyar. A restless father, Prof. S.K.Nayyar hurriedly picked up the phone. After the initial pleasantries, the man on the other side fell silent. After about a minute of ominous silence, Prof.Nayyar asked, "Did he die fighting?"

"Sir, not just the Indian Army but the entire nation is indebted to your son," the man replied.

"I want Anuj Dead or Alive."

"Anuj was the most mischievous boy in the school," says his teacher as she recalls this one incident when she had warned Anuj. "I said to him, 'Anuj, this is the last warning I'm giving you. I have received many complaints against you. Do not compel me to take stern action,' and Anuj, as always, replied with a poker face, 'Yes ma'm, sorry ma'm. I shall try to improve.' But Anuj just continued with his mischievous ways." Although he was regular troublemaker, Anuj was a bright student who constantly performed well in academics and sports. He was as brilliant in his studies as he was in his antiques. Once, tired of his ceaseless mischief, his teacher has written on the noticeboard, "I WANT ANUJ DEAD OR ALIVE."

And the Kargil war began.....

Capt. Anuj Nayyar's was second in command of the Charlie Company tasked to capture an objective, which was part of the Pimple Complex on the western slopes of Point 4875, at a height of 16,250 feet. It was just plain luck that the daredevil got the responsibility of leading his men to clear the Pimple 2 as their company commander got injured and the 23 year old Anuj took over. He called his father to inform him about his big mission in Operation Vijay. Before putting the phone down Prof.Nayyar warned his son, " हार के मत आना वर्ना गोली मार दूंगा ."(if you return losing the battle I will shoot you myself) to which Anuj shot back "पापा आप ही का बेटा हूँ । हार के आने की बात सोच भी नहीं सकता."(Papa, I'm your son. Even the thought of losing can't cross my mind). These last words of Capt. Anuj Nayyar, even today, make his father's chest swell with pride.

6th July 1999.

Capt. Anuj Nayyar was motivating his men. These seven brave men, including Capt. Anuj, had all grown up in different cities. None of them had ever seen this piece of land that the Pakistani soldiers had captured and now they were going to get it back or die trying. Capt.Anuj began addressing his men, "Boys, this is the moment we all have been waiting for. All our education, our rigorous training over the years has been in preparation for this particular day. It's our good fortune that we have been entrusted with this mission. objective is at the height of over 16,000 feet. The temperature there is 30 degrees below zero. The enemy is hiding safely in their bunkers at a very advantageous position. Boys, we might be only seven but remember we have the strength of more than Seventy."

His men gave the battle cry in unision "Jat Balwan. Jai Bhagwan." Capt. Anuj continued, "We shall climb the 80 degree gradient. Be prepared for a heavy snowfall, ceaseless artillery and mortar fire."

"Yes Sir! Hum tayyar hai, Sir,"
(We are prepared, Sir), replied his comrades. The captain further added, "The odds might seem against us. But the enemy doesn't know what we are made of. We will not forgive the enemy for capturing that part of our motherland. Our Army and this country, has put so much faith in us. This is the day we will prove our blood. "हम अपनी पल्टन की इज़्ज़त रखेंगे. खाली हाथ नहीं लौटेंगे." (We will maintain the respect and dignity of our company. We will not return empty handed.)

One of his comrade said, " Sir, दुसमन को क्षमा करना भगवन पैर छोड़ देते है मगर भगवन से उनकी मुलाकात कराना हमारी ज़िम्मेदारी है." (Sir, we will leave it to God to forgive the enemy, but it is our responsibility to fix the enemy's date with God).

"Bolo Jat Balwan Jai Bhagwan!" After the initial setback, the Indian assault split into two groups, one led by Captain Vikram Batra and other by Captain Anuj Nayyar. The Pakistani infiltrators had constructed several bunkers on Point 4875 . Anuj's company located 4 enemy bunkers and charged towards the first bunker. During the assault, Anuj fired a Rocket Propelled Grenade (RPG) following it up with hand grenades the first bunker thereby into demolishing it and killing the enemy soldiers hiding inside.

The company then charged towards the remaining 3 bunkers during which they came under heavy mortar fire from enemy which was well entrenched.

However, under Anuj's leadership, the company cleared two more bunkers and engaged in numerous hand to hand combat. In this action, Anuj though severely injured killed 9 of the enemy soldiers till they had cleared the first three Medium Machine Gun(MMG) bunkers.

"साहब अब एक ही बंकर दिख रहा है.उसे भी उड़ा देंगे." (Sir, only one last bunker can be seen. We will demolish that one too),"a severely injured, Sepoy Satyavir shouted at the top of his voice.

"Yes boys, only one....last bunker.... and the victory is ours. We can and we will,"replied Anuj.

It was then that the enemy fired on RPG from the 4th bunker, which fell directly on Captain Anuj killing him on the spot. Later that bunker was overpowered by the second company led by Captain Vikram Batra. The success of this operation, after a brief setback, was largely due to outstanding personal bravery an exemplary junior leadership of Captain Nayyar. He displayed indomitable resolve, grit and determination and motivated his command by personal example, acting beyond the call of duty. For conspicuous gallantry and supreme sacrifice, Captain Anuj Nayyar was honored with the Mahavir Chakra, posthumously.

In one of the letters from the war zone, Anuj wrote to his parents, "I am not that irresponsible that I will die without fulfilling my duties for the country. My army and my country has put so much faith in me it would be mistake to think of death at this moment. Till the last enemy is there, I will keep breathing."

Yes, Captain Anuj Nayyar, this brave son of our country is still breathing through every one of us.
